First grade boys participate with an adult. Emphasis on family skills, service to others and feelings of self-worth.



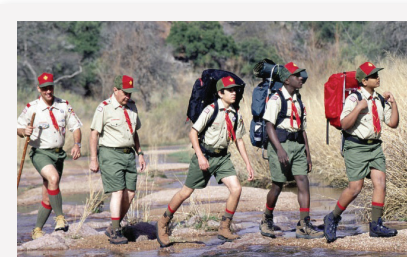
CUB SCOUTS:

Serves boys 11-18 with high adventure, hiking, camping, canoeing, merit badge advancement and leadership opportunities.



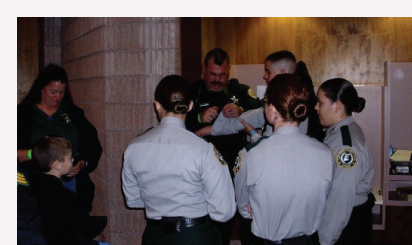
VENTURING:

MEMBERSHIP:

Over **3,990** young men and women participated in the programs of the Daniel Boone Council.

- ◆ Cub Scouts: **2,310** boys
- ◆ Boy Scouts: **1,363** young men
- ◆ Venturers: **195** young men and women
- ◆ Explorers: **127** young men and women



SERVING OTHERS:



Since 1920, **over 3,800** young men in Western North Carolina have earned the coveted rank of Eagle Scout. Through their Eagle Scout service projects, thousands of community service hours have been conducted to benefit our communities. In addition, other Scouts from our Packs, Troops and Crews also perform thousands of additional service hours on an annual basis.

- ◆ **Ninety – seven** Scouts earned the coveted rank of Eagle Scout in 2015.
- ◆ Our Scouts performed **over 20,000** hours of community service in 2015.

CAMP DANIEL BOONE:

Daniel Boone Council maintains one of the premiere camping facilities in the country, Camp Daniel Boone.

Scouts indicate that summer camp is more than just a place to have fun. It also offers Scouts the opportunity to participate in physically and intellectually challenging activities, introduces them to new and rewarding experiences and provides them with supportive and caring relationships.

Positive outcomes of Scout summer camp occur because the environment and activities at camp incorporate all of the elements of healthy youth development.

- ◆ Camp Daniel Boone camps **over 5,000** youth and leaders from over twenty states annually.
- ◆ Camp Daniel Boone employs two international staff members each summer.

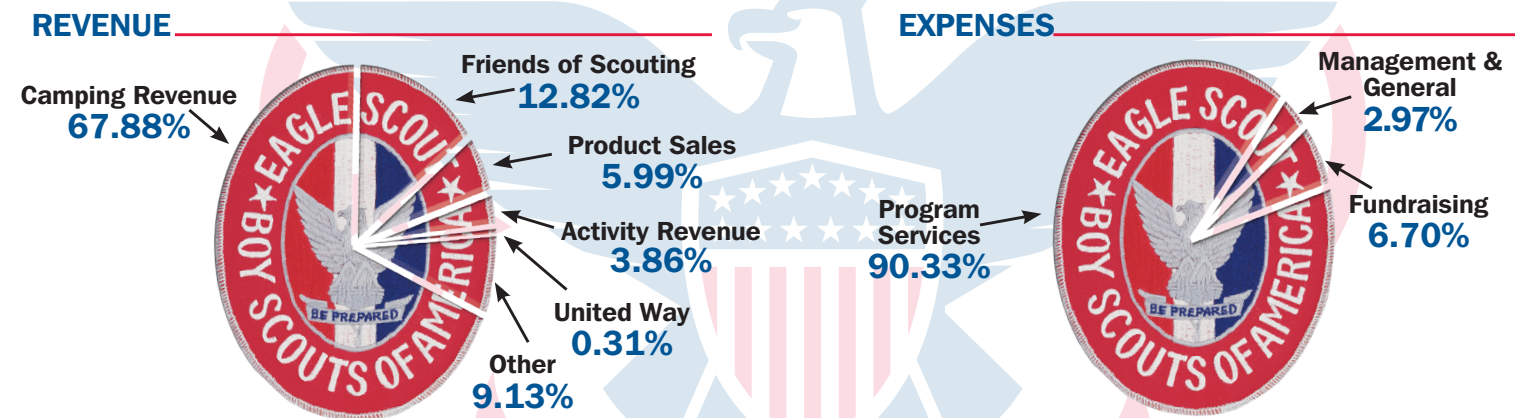


RETURN ON INVESTMENT
