Sixth-twelfth grade boys and girls. Outdoor activities with emphasis on character, citizenship and leadership training.



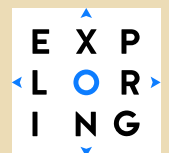
VENTURING:

Co-ed vocational program that gives teens 14-20 access to hands-on career education experiences and activities.



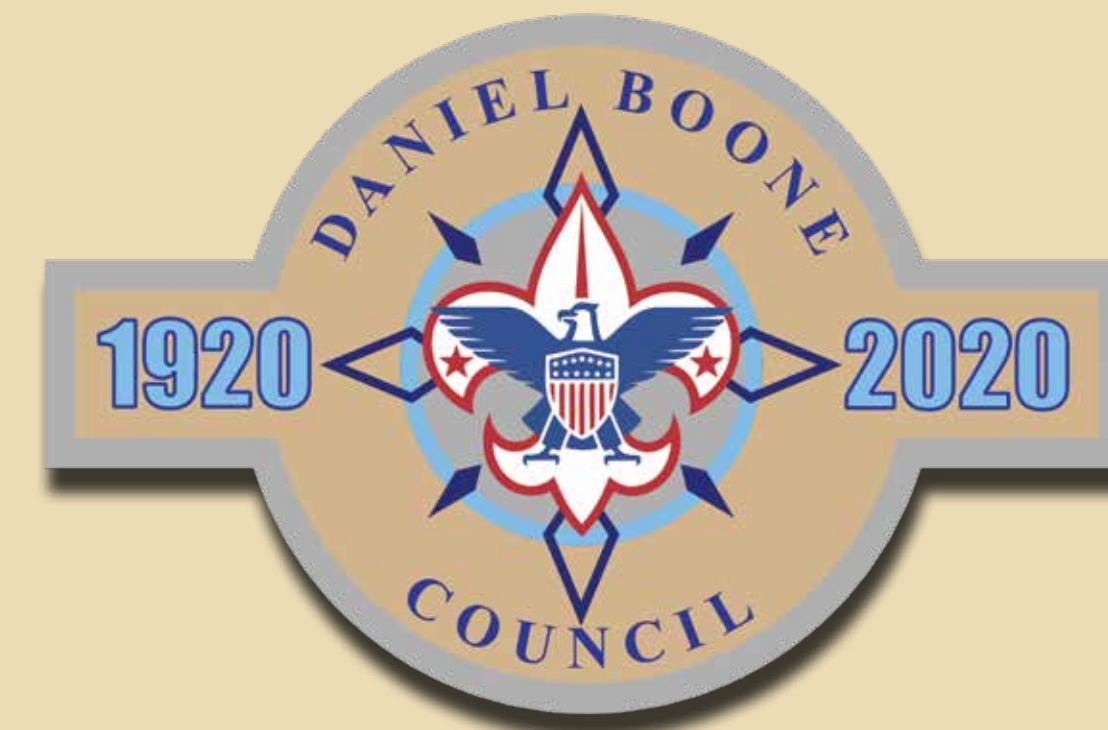

MEMBERSHIP:

Over 4,000 young men and women participated in the programs of the Daniel Boone Council.

Since 1920, over 4,190 young men in Western North Carolina have earned the rank of Eagle Scout.
